# Two New Grants

## NEW YEAR STARTS WITH FINANCIAL HELP FOR WORK WITH YOUNG PEOPLE

We have started the year with two new government grants both aimed at young unemployed people. With Future Jobs funding we have to create new jobs in the area and the Berkshire Young Peoples Project requires us to provide opportunities for young unemployed people to carry out voluntary work. Together with our existing contracts, Train to Gain for which we have received funding for another year, Response to Redundancy, IT4U, our Training For Your Future courses and the Gravelly Training Centre, these two new grants puts the company in much better shape. However, we have still got a considerable challenge for the future and with the aid of another grant from the Modernisation fund we have been able to buy in expert outside help to enable us to review the future direction of the company.

### FUTURE JOBS FUND GRANT

#### New jobs to be created

We have been awarded what could become a major new grant for us, from the Department of Works and Pensions. We are to create a minimum of thirty new jobs in the area under the Future Jobs Fund, part of the government's Backing Young Britain campaign. These will be community based positions in environmental and maintenance projects, IT and administration. The young people (18-25) will receive at least the minimum wage for the jobs which will last for six months. As a result, as well as the benefits for the young people, it will enable improvements to be made to various community facilities and properties. The jobs which are for a minimum of twenty five hours a week must be new jobs which would not have happened without the backing of the Future Jobs fund.

### TRAIN TO GAIN

#### Successful outcomes for staff and candidates

Train to Gain is a contract from the Learning and Skills Council to enable volunteers and workers in the voluntary sector to achieve NVQs. We have had considerable success recently, not only with the candidates but also with members of the company. We have had twenty one candidates who have now completed the NVQs, some in Level 3 Management, others in Level 2 Team Leading, Customer Service and Activity Leadership. The successful applicants are spread across Berkshire, Surrey and Hampshire and are involved in Scouting, Guiding and the community sectors.

In the Company, Mick Stocks, Eric Goulding, Suzanne Stout and Harriet Riley have achieved Management and Team Leading awards. In addition Eric, Mick and Nathan Bray who are involved in running the scheme have qualified as A1 Assessors.

More good news is that we have received a renewal of funding for a further year.

### BERKSHIRE YOUNG PEOPLES PROJECT

#### A new opportunity to volunteer

This grant is for a volunteering project available to young people (18-25) who are currently not in employment. The projects undertaken by the volunteers are aimed at the improvement of the environment and helping the local community and will not affect their benefits. The projects are planned to allow the volunteers to acquire a whole range of skills that will prepare them to be ready to take up work. The informal working activities will help them improve social skills such as problem solving, communication and team working, enhancing their value to prospective employers. Regular working hours will prepare them for the time when they are able to obtain full-time employment and they will have valuable experience to add to their CV.

There will also be the opportunity of learning more practical skills such as IT, money management, health and safety, manual handling and first aid. Courses aimed at motivation and confidence building will also be available. The project has already started and runs until September 2010. Our V-Reading project successfully carried out many varied community tasks and we expect this project to be as successful for all concerned.

## TRAINING FOR YOUR FUTURE

### Workplace risk courses for charities

### New sponsor required

This is a project for young people, 16-25, who are interested in IT and aimed particularly at those who are unemployed or disadvantaged. It operates two evenings a week at a Resource Centre in Bracknell and is part funded by the V-Charity, the government body for young volunteers and match funded by ASAP Computers.

Our present contract runs out in March and unless we can find new sponsors to match-fund with the V-Charity, it is likely that the project will close.

## REVIEW OF THE COMPANY'S FUTURE

### Help from the Modernisation fund

For various reasons the company has reached a crossroads in its existence and we have taken the opportunity of a grant from the Modernisation fund to review the future direction of the company. This has resulted in a great deal of thought and activity in the company culminating in a meeting of the Board and Council, using the services of outside consultant Amanda Carpenter to plan future operations. These are now actively being pursued to ensure we secure a sustainable future for the company.

## RESPONSE TO REDUNDANCY

### Getting people back to work

We are still getting people come forward for this free scheme for people facing redundancy or who have been unemployed for less than six months. We can provide a complete service from initial advice and guidance to skills training to change careers or upgrading skills and knowledge with the aim of enabling a quick return to the workplace. We are acting as agents in Berkshire for Chichester College who have the contract for the South East from the Learning and Skills Council. The scheme is managed and facilitated for us by Alan Hester.

## PREMISES

### Northway House, Bracknell

We have recently signed a new five year lease for this resource centre in Bracknell.

### Northcourt Avenue, Reading

We have let our offices to the Graft Thames Valley which has had to move from its earlier premises. Graft has received a big lottery grant for three years to provide ways into work for people with disabilities.

### GRAVELLY TRAINING CENTRE Somewhere for your next meeting?

Our purpose built Gravelly Training Centre, which is adjacent to our offices in Gravelly Court, Grazeley, is gradually being used by other organisations. It is available to hire for meetings or training sessions of up to 25 people. It is self contained with its own toilet block and a well equipped kitchen for self catering or catering can be provided. It has the latest audio-visual equipment and everything needed for a training course or meeting.

## Locally – Backing Berkshire

### BERKSHIRE SCOUTS – PROJECT AFRICA

We are delighted to be involved in the Berkshire Scouts 2011 Uganda expedition, Project Africa. This has linked with the charity Building Brighter Futures, which was started after the UK Uganda Network Millennium expedition led by Eric and Marie Goulding, founders of Building Brighter Futures. Whilst in Uganda, Berkshire Scouts will be supporting ongoing works by this charity with two special schools, the Kavule School for the Deaf and the Bukeka Children's Centre.

As well as the community work to be carried out by those Scouts taking part in the expedition, it is also hoped to involve other Scouts in the County who will be asked to collect books to provide a library in each of the two schools. There will also be an opportunity to sponsor chickens that are being kept to provide eggs for the children. It is also hoped to find sponsors for the camping equipment to be used by the Berkshire Scouts on the expedition which will be left behind for use by local Scout Groups.

### FACILITATING SERVICES FOR BERKSHIRE COUNTY SCOUT COUNCIL

As well as facilitating the employment of the County's Local Development Officer, Harriet Riley, we also

provide facilities for a part time administrator, Jackie Meakes, for Berkshire County Scout Council. Both Harriet and Jackie helped out at the recent Group Scout Leaders Conference held at Wokefield Park.

### Other Services

We also continue to provide training courses available to Scouters in the County: First Response, first aid and incident training and MIDAS providing certification for those who drive minibuses. We also provide the administrative back-up for the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme in the County.
