Berkshire County Scout Council has appointed its first full-time Local Development Officer, Harriet Riley, with part-funding from the Scout Association Development Grants Board and the support of Berkshire Scout Enterprises. The Company is facilitating the employment of Harriet, who will have her office at Gravelly Court. Her role is to take forward the Berkshire Scouts Development Project focusing on its three objectives (1) to develop further the provision of accessible Scouting to all areas of Berkshire (2) to continue to build a youth and adult membership which is more representative of the diversity across Berkshire and (3) to develop effective outreach programmes in areas of greatest need.

Geoff Mitchell, Deputy County Commissioner for Development says, "We want to bring the magic of Scouting to even more young people in Berkshire – it is a great start to the second hundred years of Scouting."
